Picture the busy people rushing around the modern day delivery room. Monitors beep. The doctors and nurses assisting the mother in her very uncomfortable time; and the fathers' waiting room filled with the

sounds of hospital noise, magazine pages turning, and expectant fathers nervously talking to one another. Quite a bit of chaos and noise accompanies a baby's birth. How different the scene from the birth of our Lord.

In the words of the Christmas Midnight Introit, the Church proclaims, "When all was still and it was midnight, your almighty Word, O Lord, descended from the royal throne," wrote Solomon in Wisdom 18:14-15. The Word made flesh descends from heaven, and is "tabernacled" in the womb of his earthly mother, the Virgin Mary, and he is born to you in the city of David!

But we are not always keepers of this sacred stillness. We daily contribute to its chaos. We find ourselves serving our own wants, needs, and desires. How often we hear the treasure of the Christmas story and treat it as a mere history lesson. We come to Christmas not as humble shepherds in awe, but as people who have gotten wrapped up in the food, gifts, and loved ones at Christmas.

This Christmas listen for the quiet of the first Christmas and the muted baaing of the gentle sheep. But, most importantly listen for "A still small voice to cry one day for me" (LSB #369) – the voice of this Babe of Bethlehem born to die on Calvary's Cross for you and the sins of the world.

May this Christmas truly be a blessed "Silent Night" as you rejoice in God's love for you!

Because God first loved us and showered His love upon us, Christmas is a time that BLC loves to demonstrate our love to others in a joyous response. As we gift others, we remember Jesus's words in John 15:5, "Apart from me you can do nothing."

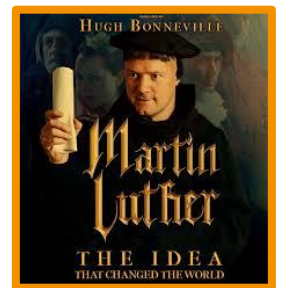
## Thank You from Pastor

## Synodical Statistics

In 2016, membership in the LCMS declined about 1.5% for confirmed and 2.1% for baptized. Simply put, we are experiencing a decline in younger members. 24% of Synod's membership is comprised of seniors compared with 15% of the national average. Average Sunday attendance is 137 across Synod.
